	<p>Lab sessions</p> <p>The lab system is unique to Japanese universities. Graduate students select a faculty advisor based on their research interests and enter their advisors' "research lab." A lab does not refer to a room for experimentation but to the group of undergraduate and graduate researchers advised by the faculty member. Lab seminars, or "zemi," are a key feature of Japanese graduate school.</p> <p>You will be attached to a faculty member's laboratory for 3 afternoons (Nov 11, 12, 13). After acceptance, we will send you a list of options, and you will indicate your preferred faculty advisors at that time.</p>
	<p>Application documents</p> <p>(1) Application form (Exported to PDF; please be sure to read the Instruction sheet)</p> <p>(2) Academic transcripts for all university programs undertaken, including information on each university's grading system (in PDF)</p>
	<p>Application deadline</p> <p>30 June 2025 (Mon) at 23:59 Japan Standard Time</p> <p>Applications sent after the deadline will not be considered.</p>
	<p>Screening</p> <p>Participants will be selected based on academic record & motivation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is no age limit. • Current doctoral students are not eligible.
	<p>Notification of acceptance</p> <p>We will notify you regarding acceptance within two weeks of the application deadline. If accepted, please respond promptly as documentation for visa applications requires preparation months in advance.</p>
